FINANCIAL UPDATE



Your Finance Committee provides the following update on our finances.

As of August 12th, we had \$23,037.93 in our church's checking account, and \$1,545.78 in the Mission Starfish Haiti account. During the first 7 months of this year, receipts for the church account exceeded expenses in 5 of those months. Here is a breakdown of those 7 months:

The following information was already published in the *Lamplighter* a few months ago, but as a refresher, here it is again. After many hours put forth on reviewing our 2019 Expense Budget and our estimated income for 2019, we knew that our expenses had to be reduced. In early March, we prepared a REVISED 2019 Expense Budget and presented it to Session. This revised budget reduced our 2019 expenses by \$10,386 and put our 2019 Expense Budget at \$165,788. The Session approved this revised budget on March 5, 2019, at a Special Session Meeting called for the purpose of reviewing and approving our revised Expense Budget. It should be noted that this reduction in the 2019 budget put the new budget at \$7,275 below our 2018 budget. Your Finance Committee felt that additional trimming should be done, and could be done in certain areas. A few budget line items were referred back to committees responsible for those line items so that recommendations could be presented to the Finance Committee. Based on those recommendations, your Finance Committee prepared a second REVISED Expense Budget for 2019 and presented it to the Session at the Regular Session Meeting on March 19, 2019. This second revised budget reduced our 2019 expenses by an additional \$4,051, and put our 2019 Expense Budget at \$161,737. The Session approved this second revision to our budget. It should also be noted that this second reduction in the 2019 budget put the new budget at \$11,326 below our 2018 budget.

Every month your Finance Committee has been meeting and keeping tight control of our expenses. We are grateful for our Office Secretary and our Pastor, as both have been working very closely with the Finance Committee in managing our finances. The various committee chairs have also been working with us on this necessary task. We still have 5 months left this year, but we feel more comfortable now than we did in the first quarter of this year. Many difficult decisions had to be made, but we are now seeing the positive results of those decisions.

Glory to God! We have such a wonderful congregation, that when called upon to help us with our finances, many stepped forward. Thanks to all who have financially helped our church.

FEED THE CHILDREN

Feed the Children had amazing summer! With our combined efforts with 1st Reformed Church we were able to serve lunches 5 days a week. The lunches included a PB&J, chips, drink, and a couple of treats, and fruit. As you all know that we had a challenge of supplying the chips as we do every year. So, for the months of June July and August we served a total of 4298 lunches! That is 88.24 boxes of chips (that amount was based on a box of 50 chips)! I want to thank everyone who supplied items for the program and to those who donated their time into preparing the lunches! This program would not be so successful if not for all who put the time and the effort.

BLOOD DRIVE

We had a very successful blood drive on August 6th. We went over our goal of donors and the Fulton High School received \$274 in grant funds! Our drive alone provided as many as 96 blood products for patients in the local area. We had a total of 32 presented donors of which 8 were deferred. We collected 25 units of blood one of which was a double red. We had also 4 first time donors. Our next blood drive will be sometime in January or February 2020. A big thank you to all who donated! We couldn't have done any of this without you!

PEACEMAKING AND RECONCILIATION

*Now may the Lord of peace . . .
give you peace at all times in all ways.*

— 2 Thessalonians 3:16

The second letter to the Thessalonians was written on the same theme as the first: the imminent return of Jesus, and the triumphal resolution of God's plan for all creation. The need for a *second* letter, though, arose from growing uneasiness, frustration, and fear within the church from those who thought this was supposed to have happened already. God's time was not the Thessalonian's time. As a result, fear and hopelessness gripped the church, resulting in divisions, mistrust, and dismay that began to sap the church of its vibrant ministry. Paul writes to encourage their continued faith and sure hope. In the midst of divisions and discord, he claims a God of peace who can bring peace at all times, in all ways.

The church of every time and place wrestles with the distance between our timeframe and expectations and God's. In God's time, even the small seeds we plant can grow into sturdy trees. In God's time, the fears we carry can be transformed into new partnership and hope. In God's time, our expectations can be expanded and surpassed by God's faithfulness. The 2019 Peace & Global Witness Offering encourages the church of our time to cast off anxiety and fear, discord and division, and embrace our reconciling God's mission to those around the corner and around the world. It is boundless peace God offers. It bursts through the shackles of time and expectation. It quiets the anxiety of each believer by joining us together, as we offer our prayer, *Now, May the Lord grant us peace in all times in all ways.*

QUICK FACTS

- Since 1940, World Communion Sunday is an ecumenical celebration of our oneness in the Spirit and the Gospel of Jesus Christ, bringing churches together in Christian unity.
- The Peace & Global Witness Offering builds on the Presbyterian Commitment to Peacemaking established in 1980.
- World Communion Sunday (October 6) is the most common Sunday for receiving the Offering, but many congregations promote the Offering throughout *A Season of Peace* (September 1 – October 6).
- 25% of the Offering stays with local congregations, and 25% with mid councils to unite congregations to support peacemaking in their regions. *See page 5 for examples of how others have used their retained funds.*
- 50% of this Offering supports the work for peace and reconciliation being done by Presbyterians across the globe.
